So it seems only appropriate that our chapter begins this season by hosting the ARS Board of Directors meeting on Sept. 13-WRS also has organized a special recorder composition contest to celebrate our 50th season as a member of ARS. Under the guidance of WRS Board member Bruce Crane, we are soliciting new compositions or arrangements for the recorder. First prize will be \$750; second prize is \$500. Also indispensable is the work of our two ex officio Board members, both former presidents.

Jane Udelson co-leads the Intermediate Group, is heading the effort to bring Gwyn Roberts to lead our fall workshop this year and arranges our spring concert. 
