

Shelley Gruskin's 2013 WRS Workshop

Question: Who has been informing, entertaining, and helping WRS recorder players on the recorder for 38 years? **Answer**: Shelly Gruskin, of course!

On Saturday, April 6, 2013, WRS will host a recorder workshop by the legendary Shelley Gruskin⁻ This will be his 39th session at WRS.

The theme of this year's workshop is "The Edge of the Imitative Style: Its Early Development and its Summit - Josquin and the Elizabethans."

Under the direction of Shelley, we will play imitative music that begins with Josquin des Pres in the early Renaissance and reaches its full development in the later Renaissance with the Elizabethans.

The music will be of intermediate difficulty. There are

few music teachers who possess Shelly's gift of gentle humor and his ability to make insightful analogies between music and other things, from baseball to Baltic dancing. As always, it will be almost as enjoyable to hear Shelly discuss music as it will be to play under his direction. And we may be so fortunate to hear Shelley perform on his favorite recorder, the alto.

We will be announcing the winners of the contest on May 1 and the two winning pieces will be performed at our Spring Concert. It was suggested at our latest Board meeting that we should record these performances as MIDI files for visitors to the Web site to listen to. Plans for Concert and Master Class Announced
