Ms. Roberts has a Performers Certificate from Utrect Conservatory and she's studied with Marian
Verbruggen and Leo Meilink.
As a performer, she's appeared
with the Washington Bach
Consort and Piffaro. She is
Director of Early Music at the
University of Pennsylvania and
associate director of the
Amherst Early Music Festival.

Playing the fun interesting music Ms.Roberts chooses for these workshops is one of the reasons to attend, plus the interesting comments regarding performance practice and historical background Gwyn adds as we play.

A Word about Organization

Newcomers to WRS will want to know how we operate. We usually play twice a month on the first and third Mondays from 8-10 p.m. The Nova meetings are led by Dick Shrager and sometimes by David McGown. We all play as a recorder orchestra. The Antiqua meetings usually begin with a mini concert and then break into smaller playing groups based on ability and experience. Depending on demand some groups may be combined. There is a mixed consort group where players of other instruments are invited. This is an advanced group and players are expected to ber able to hold their own playing

one to a part.

Our governing agency is our Board of Directors. Following elections in the spring. the new board elects officers. This year our President is Vickie Walter, Vice President and Newsletter Editor is Bruce Crane. Members-at-large are Anne Hinton, Daniel Bruner, David McGown and Brie Salzmn.
